Charlton Trezevant

Lomax Elementary is a magnet school specializing in math, science and technology located in east Tampa. Because of our school's focus, we have 2 computer labs, Smart Boards in every classroom, computer carts, laptops and numerous amounts of other technology. We no longer have a technology teacher, therefore it is the media specialist's job to take care of the technology throughout the school.

This has become a monumental task but fortunately Charleton Trezevant came to the rescue! Charlton began volunteering in September 2014 and has been coming faithfully every Monday (on early release days). While at Lomax he works on technology issues throughout the school. Charlton troubleshoots computer and printer issues in all the teacher's classrooms and in our 2 computer labs. Additionally, he assists with updating memory, school's website/webpages, and can be usually found crawling on the floor trying to hook something up.

This is quite a time commitment as Charlton's father has to drive him to Lomax (as he does not have his drivers license yet) which is about 30 minutes away from his high school. Charlton stays at least 2 hours every Monday working under the supervision of the media specialist.

Charlton's volunteerism has made a huge and immeasurable impact throughout our school. Technology use occurs every day in our school and without his help many of our computer labs and student work stations would not be in working order. (The time it takes for district personnel to come to the school and fix an issue is usually a 2-3 week wait). The fact that Charlton is able to resolve most of the computer issues himself in a timely manner allows our students and teachers quick and easy access to technology.

Despite Charlton having a full load of classes (4 AP classes), he still takes the time to volunteer even though he has already accumulated over 138 community service hours. Seeing the desperate need for teachers and students to have working computers, Charlton took the initiative by talking to the administration at his high school and began a "tech club". Tech club members go around the high school assisting faculty members with technology issues.

As you can see, Charlton Trezevant continues to invest his time and talents helping students and teachers at Lomax Elementary. His volunteerism has made a significant impact on the entire school and we appreciate his ongoing commitment.
